<p><i>You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain for the LORD will not leave him unpunished who takes His name in vain.</i></p>	<p><i>To keep the Sabbath holy.</i></p>
<p><i>Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath of the LORD your God; in it you shall not do any work, you or your son or your daughter, your male or your female servant or your cattle or your sojourner who stays with you. For in six days the LORD made the heaven and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and made it holy.</i></p>	<p><i>To worship God in a proper manner and to avoid idolatry.</i></p>
<p><i>You shall have no other gods before Me.</i></p>	<p><i>To worship God alone.</i></p>
<p><i>You shall not make for yourself an idol or any likeness of what is in heaven above, or on the earth beneath, or in the water under the earth. You shall not worship them or serve them; for I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children, on the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me, but showing lovingkindness to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments.</i></p>	<p><i>To reverence God's name, word and works.</i></p>

2	You shall not make for <i>yourself</i> an <i>idol</i> or any likeness of what is in <i>heaven</i> above, or on the <i>earth</i> beneath, or in the <i>water</i> under the earth. You shall not <i>worship</i> them or <i>serve</i> them; for I, the <i>Lord</i> your God, am a <i>jealous</i> God, visiting the <i>iniquity</i> of the <i>fathers</i> on the children, on the third and <i>fourth</i> generations of those who <i>hate</i> Me, but showing <i>lovingkindness</i> to thousands, to those who <i>love</i> Me and keep My <i>commandments</i> .	Q83. What does the second commandment teach you?	<i>To worship God in a proper manner and to avoid idolatry.</i>
3	You shall <i>not</i> take the <i>name</i> of the <i>Lord</i> your God in <i>vain</i> for the LORD will not <i>leave</i> him <i>unpunished</i> who <i>takes</i> His name in <i>vain</i> .	Q85. What does the third commandment teach you?	<i>To reverence God's name, word and works.</i>
4	Remember the <i>sabbath</i> day, to keep it <i>holy</i> . <i>Six</i> days you shall <i>labor</i> and do all your <i>work</i> , but the seventh <i>day</i> is a <i>sabbath</i> of the LORD your God; in it you shall <i>not</i> do any work, you or your <i>son</i> or your daughter, your <i>male</i> or your female <i>servant</i> or your <i>cattle</i> or your sojourner who <i>stays</i> with you. For in <i>six</i> days the LORD made the <i>heaven</i> and the earth, the <i>sea</i> and all that is in them, and <i>rested</i> on the <i>seventh</i> day; therefore the LORD <i>blessed</i> the <i>sabbath</i> day and made it <i>holy</i> .
